



Book Club in a Bag

Lady in the Lake by Laura Lippman

- 1. What do you think inspired a middle age housewife to become an aspiring writer who pursues the murder of a forgotten young woman?
- 2. Why do you think Cleo Sherwood's death was forgotten? Why is Maddie so determined to find the truth?
- 3. Maddie's investigation brings her in contact with people who are on the periphery of her life, such as a jewellery store clerk and a waitress. Why do you think Maddie often fails to see the people right in front her? How does this echo the case she is trying to solve?
- 4. How did the pace of the book impact your reading experience? Was it too fast/too slow/just right?
- 5. Discuss the cover of the book. How does it impact your reading of the story?
- 6. Kirkus Reviews is quoted: "The story is bigger than the crime, and the crime bigger than its solution, making Lippman's skill as a mystery novelist work as icing on the cake... The racism, classism, and sexism of 50 years ago wrapped up in a stylish, sexy, suspenseful period drama about a newsroom and the city it covers." Discuss this review.
- Maddie and Cleo are from different worlds, but their stories often depict similar struggles. Discuss how their lives were similar and different.
- 8. Cleo's perspective is written from the first person whereas Maddie's is written from the third. How does this style influence your reading and connection with each character?
- 9. The *Washington* Post describes Lady *in the Lake* as a love letter to Baltimore newspapers and an homage to the city and its people. Do you agree with this statement?

Terms of Loan

- 12 copies are included in this kit.

- No renewals.
- Kit may be picked up at or returned to any branch.
- Kit must be returned at the desk during operating hours, not through an exterior drop box.
- All 12 items are checked out to one member's card.
- The member who borrowed the kit is responsible for:
